- ▶ **COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND/OR VOLUNTEER WORK**

Complete the application and send it, with your 500 word outline and a signed recommendation from your course director/professor, to the Broadcast Executives Society (BES).

Winning one of these prestigious scholarships will bring you \$1,500 and an important advantage when seeking employment in the highly competitive broadcasting industry.
